Dear Messrs. Smrt and Donald:

Enclosed please find a chart I have prepared regarding Franklin High School football players from July 1, 2004 through the present who have immigrated from American Samoa. Also attached are copies of the pertinent forms which we have been able to locate thus far.

As I am sure you are aware, American Samoa is a territory of the United States, and American Samoans are American Nationals with the right to move about freely within the United States.

As you proceed with your investigation, I hope that you have taken, or will take the time to fully investigate the culture and practices of the American Samoan community, particularly as it relates to their commitment to travel, migration and the pursuit of better educational and economic opportunities in other parts of the United States.

There is a relatively large American Samoan community in Stockton, primarily concentrated within the Franklin High School area. American Samoans tend to move where other American Samoans are located, as do many other immigrants. Such tendency is further encouraged by American Samoans strong belief in community, and fulfillment of that duty through mutual assistance, concepts which also inhere in an extended sense of family and kinship. Indeed, American Samoans are noted for their unique ability to preserve their sense of community and culture even when living far from their native islands.

American Samoans also have a strong tendency to migrate to California or Hawaii, in the pursuit of


better educational and economic opportunities. American Samoa itself is composed of several small islands, which are relatively isolated (Hawaii is over 2,000 miles away), which comprise an area roughly equivalent to the size of Washington, D.C., and where the per capital income is very low, about \$5,000. The primary opportunities in American Samoa itself are to work either for one of the two large fish canneries or to work for the government. Additionally, the only post-high school educational institution is a single community college. Accordingly, there is a strong incentive for American Samoans to migrate, and it is reported that substantially more American Samoans live overseas – an estimated 500,000 worldwide -- than live in American Samoa itself, which has a population of about 65,000.

Since World War II, American football has held a strong attraction for American Samoans as an excellent opportunity to attain educational and economic success. In addition to a culture based upon travel, mutual support and seeking better opportunities elsewhere, American Samoans tend to be large, strong, nimble and mentally tough, a result perhaps of the many battles which characterized the islands' history. Obviously, these qualities lend themselves to success in American football. The National Football League has over 200 players of Samoan descent, and it is said that an American Samoan male is 40 times more likely to play in the NFL than a non-Samoan American male. These same qualities which render American Samoans fit for football, also make them adept as soldiers, and combined with their strong sense of patriotism, has resulted in an unusually large number of American Samoans enlisted in the United States armed forces.

I believe that you will find that the contribution of American Samoans to Franklin High School's football program grows out of these cultural and economic roots, and reflects the attractions of educational and economic opportunities unavailable in their home islands. Far from being the result of some "undue influence" by any Stockton School District employee, these young mens' migration reflects the culture and community of which they are a part, as well as a classic example, of Americans striving to better themselves and fulfill their goals. Rather than punishing them for pursuing that dream, a sounder approach might be for more communities to open their hearts and doors to these fellow Americans.
