A Real-Life Dr. Doolittle Sonya Fitzpatrick was born in central England, in a quiet rural village, where she acquired a deep love for all animals. I'm [REDACTED] with a Healthcare Administration background. I'm amazed at how there's no intelligent OB/GYN doctor (as of yet) who has spoken up about why Laci & Scott's baby boy Conner could have obtained body lacerations.
